DID YOU KNOW?

Fourth of July is coming up! You're probably looking forward to getting back to normal and gathering with family and friends this year. Maybe you're hosting a party or barbecue! Here are some recycling and waste reduction tips for your upcoming event:

- Red Solo® cups are recyclable if they are <u>clean</u>, <u>dry</u> and <u>empty</u>. Styrofoam
 is <u>not</u> recyclable in Tehama County. There are no viable, cost effective
 recycling markets for Styrofoam.
- Greasy pizza boxes are <u>not</u> recyclable. Paper products must be free of
 grease and food residue in order for them to be processed into pulp that
 can be made into recycled paper products. You can separate the lid of
 your pizza box if it's clean, and put it into the recycling. The bottom greasy
 part goes in your trash can.
- Not sure how much food to make for your party? Planning ahead will save you money and help prevent food waste. Check out this article for some tips on figuring out how much food to make for your party! https://grillagrills.com/bbq-food-planner/
- Save your yogurt and other food containers to use for leftover food for your guests to bring home. This is a great way to make sure that any extra food doesn't go to waste!
- Drinking soda and other CRV beverages at your party? Make sure you
 recycle your bottles and cans, or bring them to a beverage container
 recycling center for cash. Remember: beverage containers must be <u>clean</u>,
 <u>dry</u> and <u>empty</u> in order to be recycled or redeemed for cash.
- Remember to safely store any unused fireworks or bring them to a
 household hazardous waste collection event (listed below) to properly
 dispose of them. Unused fireworks should never go in the trash or
 recycling bin.
