## SECTION 04 34 00

## FULL BRICK VENEER

#### PART 1 GENERAL

#### 1.01 DESCRIPTION

- A. This Section describes the requirements for installing FULL BRICK VENEER SYSTEM.
- B. Penetrating masonry sealer.

#### 1.02 SUBMITTALS

A. Product Data: Manufacturer's product

#### 1.03 QUALITY ASSURANCE

- A. Masonry work shall conform to CBC Chapter 21.
- B. Tolerances:
  - Variation from Plumb: For vertical lines and surfaces of columns, walls and arises, do not exceed 1/4-inch in 10-feet, or 3/8-inch in 20-feet, nor 1/2-inch in 40-feet or more. For external corners, expansion joints, control joints and other conspicuous lines, do not exceed 1/4-inch in 20-feet maximum, nor 1/2-inch in 40-feet or more. For vertical alignment of head joints do not exceed plus or minus 1/4-inch in 10-feet, 1/2-inch maximum.
  - 2. Variation from Level: For bed joints and lines of exposed lintels, sills, horizontal grooves and other conspicuous lines, do not exceed 1/4-inch in 20-feet maximum, nor 1/2-inch in 40-feet or more. For top surface of bearing walls, do not exceed 1/8-inch between adjacent floor elements in 10-feet or 1/16-inch within width of a single unit.
  - 3. Variation of Linear Building Line: For position shown in plan and related portion of columns, walls and partitions, do not exceed 1/2-inch in any bay or 20-feet maximum, nor 3/4-inch in 40-feet or more.
  - 4. Variation in Mortar Joint Thickness: Do not exceed bed joint thickness indicated or specified by more than plus or minus 1/8-inch, with a maximum thickness limited to 1/2-inch. Do not exceed head joint thickness indicated or specified by more than plus or minus 1/8-inch.
  - 5. Maximum variation from unit to adjacent unit: 1/16 inch.

### 1.04 PRODUCT STORAGE, AND HANDLING

- A. Owner furnished brick materials will be delivered to Project site in a cleaned, orderly condition on pallets.
- B. Store and handle masonry units to prevent damage or deterioration from moisture, temperature changes, contaminants, corrosion, or other causes. Cover all brick when there is a chance of any form of precipitation.

#### 1.05 JOB CONDITIONS

- A. Environmental Requirements:
  - 1. Install brick veneer units when surrounding temperature is 40-deg. F. or above.
  - 2. Maintain temperature above 40-deg. F. for at least 24-hours after installation.

#### PART 2 - PRODUCTS

#### 2.01 BRICK VENEER UNITS

- A. Basis of design: HC Muddox standard brick solid. Color to match existing bricks.
- B. Or accepted Equal

#### 2.02 REINFORCEMENT

A. Reinforcing Bars: ASTM A615 Grade 60 deformed bars except as otherwise indicated.

## 2.03 JOINT SEALANTS

A. Control Joints: Preformed rubber in profiles indicated or required; Dur-O-Wal, Inc. "Rapid Control Joint" or approved equal.

#### 2.05 MASONRY CLEANERS

A. Job-Mixed Detergent Solution: Solution of trisodium phosphate (1/2-cup dry measure) and laundry detergent (1/2-cup dry measure) dissolved in one gallon of water.

#### 2.06 PENETRATING MASONRY SEALER

A. Silicon based surface applied water repellent. Colorless, non-staining.

## **PART 3 - EXECUTION**

#### 3.01 INSTALLATION, GENERAL

- A. Thickness: Build masonry construction to the full thickness indicated. Build single wythe walls to the thickness of the masonry units, using units of nominal thickness specified.
- B. Cut masonry units with motor-driven saw producing clean sharp, unchipped edges.
  - 1. Cut units as required to provide pattern indicated and to fit adjoining work neatly.
  - 2. Use full units without cutting wherever possible.
- C. Do not wet brick veneer units.
- D. Layout walls in advance for accurate spacing of surface bond patterns with uniform joint widths. Locate openings, movement-type joints, returns and offsets. Avoid use of less than half-size units at corners, jambs and other locations.
- E. Lay walls plumb, with courses level, accurately spaced and coordinated with other work.
- F. Pattern Bond: Lay exposed masonry in running bond unless otherwise indicated.
- G. Stopping and Resuming Work: Rake back 1/2-masonry unit length in each course; do not tooth. Clean exposed surfaces of set masonry, and remove loose masonry units and mortar prior to laying fresh masonry.
- H. Built-In Work: Build-in items specified under this and other Sections as the work progresses.
  - 1. Fill space between structural steel frames and masonry with silicone joint filler. Use mortar for other frames.
- I. Placing Reinforcement:
  - 1. Clean reinforcing of loose rust, mill scale, earth, and other materials which will reduce bond to mortar or grout.
  - 2. Do not use reinforcement with kinks or bends not indicated, or bars with reduced cross-section.
  - 3. Position reinforcing accurately as indicated.
    - a. Support and secure vertical bars against displacement. Support bars at top and bottom courses and at intervals not to exceed 192 bar diameters.
    - b. Horizontal reinforcing may be placed as the masonry work progresses.
    - c. Where vertical bars are in close proximity, provide a clear distance between bars of not less than the greater of the nominal bar diameter or 1-inch.
    - d. For columns, piers and pilasters, provide a clear distance between vertical bars of not less than 1-1/2-times the nominal bar diameter or 1-1/2-inches, whichever is greater. Provide lateral ties as indicated.
  - 4. Splice reinforcing only where indicated.
    - a. Provide lapped splices, unless otherwise indicated.
    - b. In splicing vertical bars or attaching to dowels, lap ends and wire tie.
  - 5. Weld splices where indicated. Comply with the requirements of AWS D1.4 for welding materials and procedures.

#### 3.02 MORTAR BEDDING AND JOINTING

- A. Lay masonry units with full mortar coverage on horizontal and vertical surfaces.
- B. Joints: Lay walls with 3/8-inch joints, except for minor variations required to maintain bond alignment.
  - 1. Cut joints flush for masonry walls concealed or to be covered by other materials.
  - 2. Tool exposed joints slightly concave using a jointer larger than joint thickness.
  - 3. Rake out mortar in joints to receive caulking or sealants.
- C. Remove masonry units disturbed after laying; clean and relay in fresh mortar.
  - 1. Do not pound corners at jambs to fit stretcher units which have been set in position.
  - 2. If adjustments are required, remove units, clean off mortar, and reset in fresh mortar.

#### 3.03 CONTROL AND EXPANSION JOINTS

- A. Provide vertical expansion, control and isolation joints in masonry where indicated.
- B. Build flanges of metal expansion strips into masonry. Lap each joint 4-inches in direction of flow. Seal joints below grade and at junctures with horizontal expansion joints.

#### 3.04 LINTELS

- A. Provide steel lintels at openings of more than 12-inches without structural steel or other supporting lintels.
  - 1. Provide 8-inch minimum bearing at each jamb, unless otherwise indicated.

#### 3.05 REPAIR, POINTING AND CLEANING, AND PROTECTION

- A. Remove and replace masonry units which are loose, chipped, broken, stained or otherwise damaged, or if units do not match adjoining units as intended. Provide new units to match adjoining units and install in fresh mortar or grout, pointed to eliminate evidence of replacement.
- B. Pointing:
  - 1. During tooling of joints, enlarge voids or holes, except weep holes, and fill with mortar.
  - 2. Point-up joints at corners, openings and adjacent work to provide a neat, uniform appearance, properly prepared for application of caulking or sealant compounds.
- C. Final Cleaning: After mortar is thoroughly set and cured, clean masonry as follows:
  - 1. Remove large mortar particles by hand with wooden paddles and non-metallic scrape hoes or chisels.
  - 2. Test cleaning methods on sample wall panel; leave 1/2 panel uncleaned for comparison purposes. Obtain Architect's approval of sample cleaning before proceeding with masonry cleaning.

- 3. Protect adjacent stone and non-masonry surfaces from contact with cleaner by covering with liquid strippable masking agent, polyethylene film or waterproof masking tape.
- 4. Saturate wall surfaces with water prior to application of cleaners; remove cleaners promptly by rinsing with clear water.
- 5. Clean concrete unit masonry to comply with masonry manufacturer's directions and applicable NCMA "Tek" bulletins.
- D. Protection: Provide and maintain protection to ensure unit masonry is without damage and deterioration at time of Substantial Completion.

The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. The date, 07/01/2024 in the example, is the effective date of the most current negotiated

rate.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all changes over time that are reported to WHD in the rates in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing the classification.

#### Union Average Rate Identifiers

The UAVG identifier indicates that no single rate prevailed for those classifications, but that 100% of the data reported for the classifications reflected union rates. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 01/01/2024. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the State of Ohio. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. The date, 01/01/2024 in the example, indicates the date the wage determination was updated to reflect the most current union average rate.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January, to reflect a weighted average of the current rates in the collective bargaining agreements on which the rate is based.

#### Survey Rate Identifiers

The ""SU"" identifier indicates that either a single non-union rate prevailed (as defined in 29 CFR 1.2) for this classification in the survey or that the rate was derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As a weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SUFL2022-007 6/27/2024. SU indicates the rate is a single non-union prevailing rate or a weighted average of survey data for that classification. FL indicates the State of Florida. 2022 is the year of the survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. The date, 6/27/2024 in the example, indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

?SU? wage rates typically remain in effect until a new survey is conducted. However, the Wage and Hour Division (WHD) has the discretion to update such rates under 29 CFR 1.6(c)(1).

#### State Adopted Rate Identifiers

The ""SA"" identifier indicates that the classifications and prevailing wage rates set by a state (or local) government were adopted under 29 C.F.R 1.3(g)-(h). Example: SAME2023-007

01/03/2024. SA reflects that the rates are state adopted. ME refers to the State of Maine. 2023 is the year during which the state completed the survey on which the listed classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. The date, 01/03/2024 in the example, reflects the date on which the classifications and rates under the ?SA? identifier took effect under state law in the state from which the rates were adopted.

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WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

a) a survey underlying a wage determination
b) an existing published wage determination
c) an initial WHD letter setting forth a position on
a wage determination matter
d) an initial conformance (additional classification and rate) determination

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be directed to the WHD Branch of Wage Surveys. Requests can be submitted via email to davisbaconinfo@dol.gov or by mail to:

2) If an initial decision has been issued, then any interested party (those affected by the action) that disagrees with the decision can request review and reconsideration from the Wage

and Hour Administrator (See 29 CFR Part 1.8 and 29 CFR Part 7). Requests for review and reconsideration can be submitted via email to dba.reconsideration@dol.gov or by mail to:

The request should be accompanied by a full statement of the interested party's position and any information (wage payment data, project description, area practice material, etc.) that the requestor considers relevant to the issue.

3) If the decision of the Administrator is not favorable, an interested party may appeal directly to the Administrative Review Board (formerly the Wage Appeals Board). Write to:
