Agricultural Material

Used Motor Oil — accepted at the Landfill free of charge year-round during Landfill business hours. Check in at scalehouse before pumping. All used motor oil is recycled.

Pesticides — accepted during Hazardous Waste Collection Events. Contact the Waste Management Agency at (530) 528-1103 to schedule a drop-off. Small fees apply for businesses.

Plastic Pesticide Containers — accepted at the Landfill free of charge year-round during Landfill business hours. As long as pesticide containers are triple rinsed and have their lids, handles, and labels removed, there is no limit to how many you can turn in. Be sure to quarter containers that are larger than 5 gallons.

Appliances, Major

When you purchase a new appliance, many dealers take away your old one. There is a special item fee for dropping off appliances at the Landfill in addition to the weight of the item. There is an additional fee for refrigerated appliances containing Freon. To avoid the **Freon** fee, the refrigerant must be removed by a certified technician and the Authorization Certificate must be presented at drop-off. Some chest freezers, pre-1972 washing machines, sump pumps, and electric space heaters contain electrical switches with about 3.5 grams of mercury each. The switches must be removed. Please call (530) 528-1103 for more information. Many appliances have motors with oil that must also be removed.

Paper

Paper is recyclable! All envelopes (including the ones with plastic windows and metal brackets), colored paper, flyers, printer paper, postcards (including matte and high-gloss postcards), newsletters, catalogues, magazines, newsprint, calendars, chipboard (cereal box material), and cardboard are recyclable!

If you are recycling SHREDDED paper, contain it in paper bags (labeled SHREDDED PAPER) or clear plastic garbage bags.

Pesticide

The best way to transport or dispose of pesticides is according to the directions on the label. Very old containers may contain product that now is banned for use. These must be disposed of as hazardous waste. To determine if a pesticide is currently banned, contact the Tehama County Agriculture Department at (530) 527-4504. Unlabeled, banned, or unused pesticides are considered hazardous waste and must be disposed at the facilities listed below. Please call for specific collection dates. What is Vermicomposting?

Vermicompost is a natural process of using earthworms (and associated micro-organisms) to break down organic waste and convert it into a rich material loaded with plant nutrients called worm castings. This dramatically speeds up the composting process and boosts the nutrient content of the end product.

Yard Waste

Large loads of yard waste (including leaves, branches, grass clippings, and other plant material) can be brought to the Landfill for a small fee. Real Christmas trees are recyclable, too; just make sure to remove all decorations before recycling the tree!

Wood

What is Grasscycling?

Grasscycling means that lawn clippings stay on the lawn. This encourages healthy grass, because clippings add valuable nitrogen to the soil. For best results, use a mulching mower and mow less than 1/3 the height of the grass.
