

ADA Path Surface Compliance Checklist

1. Surface Stability

- [] Surface does not shift under foot or wheels.
- [] Surface is resistant to deformation.

2. Firmness

- [] Surface is solid and compact.
- [] No excessive give or bounce.

3. Slip Resistance

- [] Adequate traction in dry and wet conditions.
- [] No polished or slick finishes.

4. Material Type

- [] Acceptable materials used (e.g., concrete, asphalt, wood, tile).
- [] Gravel/dirt stabilized with binders, grids, or compaction.

5. Surface Smoothness

- [] No abrupt changes in level or uneven textures.
- [] Avoid cobblestones or rough pavers.

6. Changes in Level

- [] <= 1/4 inch: no treatment needed.
- [] > 1/4 inch and <= 1/2 inch: beveled at 1:2 slope.
- [] > 1/2 inch: treated as ramp (slope <= 1:12) or walkway (slope <= 1:20).

7. Openings in Surface

- [] Openings do not exceed 1/2 inch diameter.

- [] Elongated openings are perpendicular to travel direction.

8. Carpeted Surfaces

- [] Carpet securely attached.
- [] Pile height <= 1/2 inch.
- [] Firm backing and edge trim in place.

9. Maintenance

- [] Surface free of debris, ice, or water pooling.
- [] Regular inspections and repairs scheduled.
