Our instructors and staff do a great job educating local students, but many classrooms and facilities in the Shasta-Tehama-Trinity Joint Community College District are outdated or inadequate to provide students with the facilities they need to succeed.

Although classrooms, labs, and facilities have been well maintained over the years, aging buildings must be upgraded since many do not meet 21st century standards. Shasta College's main campus has classrooms that are almost 60 years old. By investing in Shasta College, we can meet today's technological and educational standards and provide better job-training services to improve our communities for years to come.

Approving Measure C will improve our campuses without increasing tax rates.

Measure C will provide funding to make improvements throughout the District including:

- Constructing a new training facility in Tehama County for welding and agriculture jobs
- Expanding Emergency Medical Services (EMS) and Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) labs and facilities
- Upgrading inadequate building systems
- Modernizing science and math labs
- Making improvements for students and visitors with disabilities

Measure C makes financial sense and protects taxpayers.

- Will not increase tax rates.
- By law, spending must be annually audited and reviewed by an independent citizens' oversight committee.
- All bond funds must be spent locally and **cannot be taken by the State**.
- Funds are required to be spent only on local college facilities, not for administrator or instructor salaries.

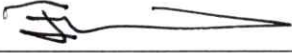
